Acceptable Use of Funding Guidance for Completing LDCP Project Charter, Section 6.0

The maximum funding that can be requested is \$125,000. Funds must be applied towards the direct costs of the project for which they were awarded. The table below highlights some acceptable uses of LDCP funding. PHO reserves the right to modify and/or add non-eligible items at any time through the tenure of the award.
