2	BEFORE aseptic procedure	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately before any aseptic procedure; for instance: changing a dressing, oral care, drawing blood, administering IV medication To protect the patient against harmful germs, including the patient's own germs, entering his or her body
	AFTER body fluid exposure risk	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and after glove removal) To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful patient germs
	AFTER patient / patient environment contact	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands when leaving the patient's environment: • after touching patient or • after touching any object or furniture To protect yourself and the next patient from harmful patient germs









CLEAN YOUR HANDS immediately before any aseptic procedure; for instance: changing a dressing, oral care, drawing blood, administering IV medication

WHY: To protect the patient against harmful germs, including the patient's own germs, entering his or her body










CLEAN YOUR HANDS immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and after glove removal)
