

Reportable disease trends interactive tool: How-to guide

1. To get started, enter the disease name you're looking for the in the **search box**.

Search or select a disease:

2. Once the disease loads, by default you will see a **graph** that outlines rates and cases by all ages and all sexes in Ontario from 2005, until the most recent surveillance year. In this section, you can slice data by age, sex, rates, cases, geographic area, as well as some combinations of these criteria.



In some cases, you will also see several **tabs** that provide detailed information such as:

- geography (which includes an interactive map)
- hospitalizations
- deaths
- organism details

and more. The tabs vary from disease to disease, depending on what information is available

3. Annotate the data by clicking the **Annotate** button. If you have a lot of information to highlight, try different colours or line sizes. Once you click the Save button, your image will download automatically.*
